

Theory of Change: Realizing the rights of persons with disabilities through UNDP support for CRPD implementation at global, regional and country levels (based on UNDP Guidance Note, 3 December 2012 and UNDP Diversity and Inclusiveness Strategy, OHR, 2013)



Assumptions:


- 1. Programming covers 4 key CPRD principles critically relevant to UNDP support (non-discrimination, participation, accessibility, accountability)
- 2. Twin-track approach of 'mainstreaming' and 'targeted' interventions incorporated in UNDP's work
- 3. Enabling national environment exists or opportunities are available for UN system to promote CRPD provisions

In this evaluation, the work of UNDP has been considered through the four key principles of the CRPD



key findings

Empowered lives. Resilient nations.



Inconsistent tracking of support to persons with disabilities and uneven efforts to mainstream across countries

Insufficient attention to the severe problems faced by persons with disabilities affected by crisis

Too few examples of targeted interventions in support of women with disabilities

Joint programming, while modest, has demonstrated success and innovation (UNPRPD)

No real effort to employ persons with disabilities and some facilities are not accessible



International Organisations: Disability-inclusive development



Key Lessons learned:

- Make disability-inclusiveness a priority
- Develop mainstreaming guidelines and accessibility standards
- Provide sufficient funding
- Build internal capacity
- Collect data
- Recruit persons with disabilities
- Develop and implement policy of reasonable accommodation




