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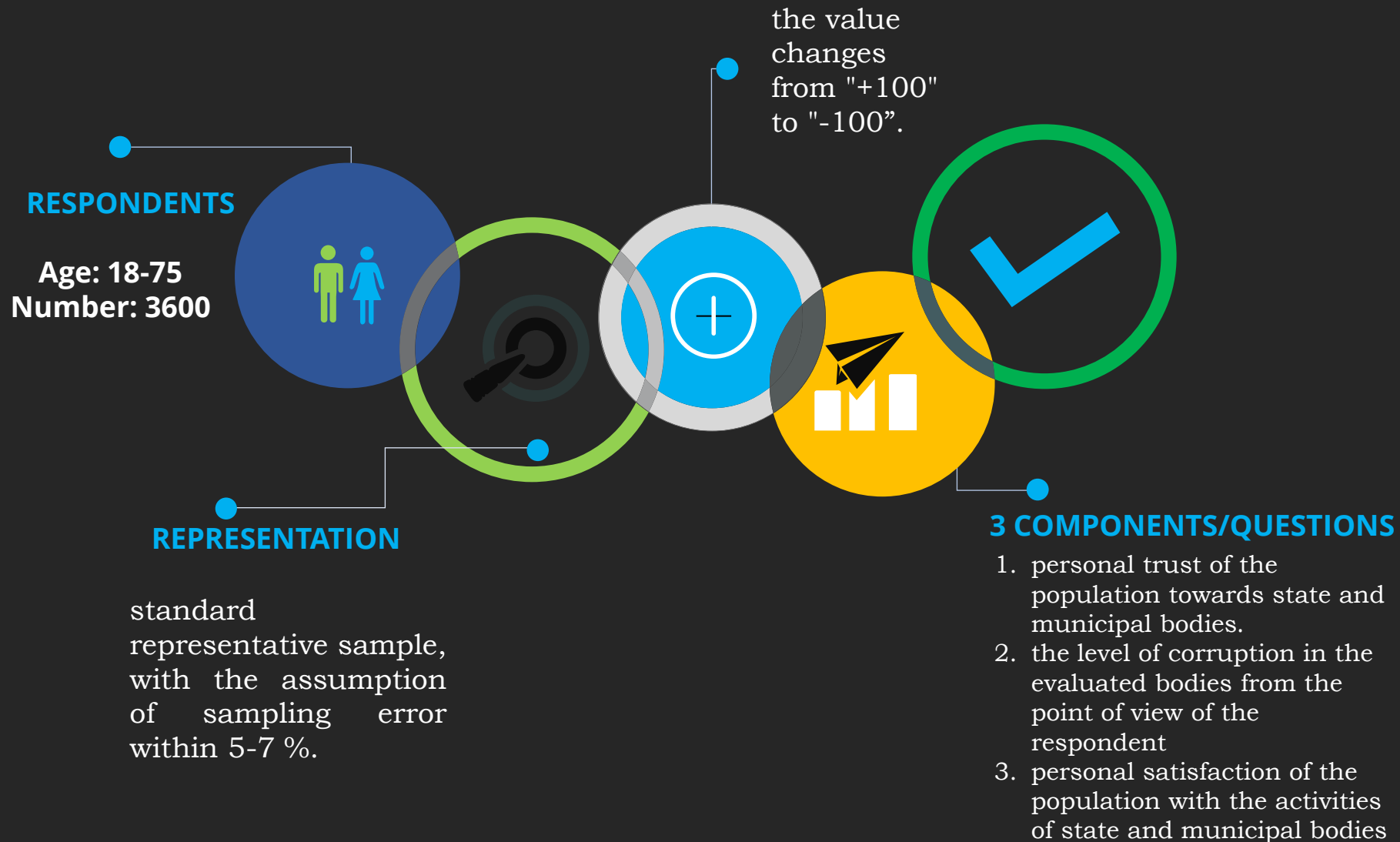

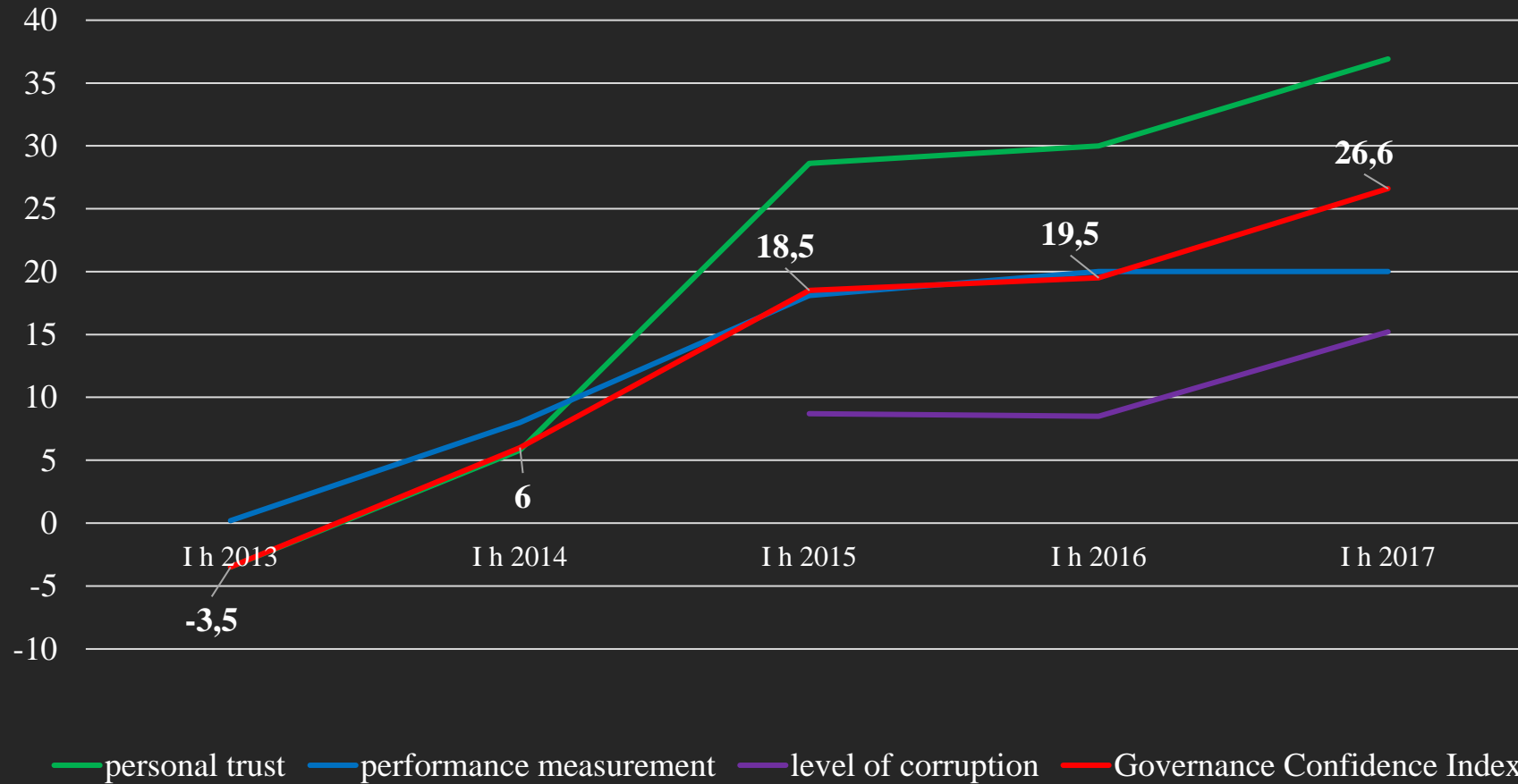
## *Results and future plans:*

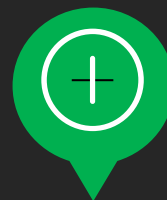

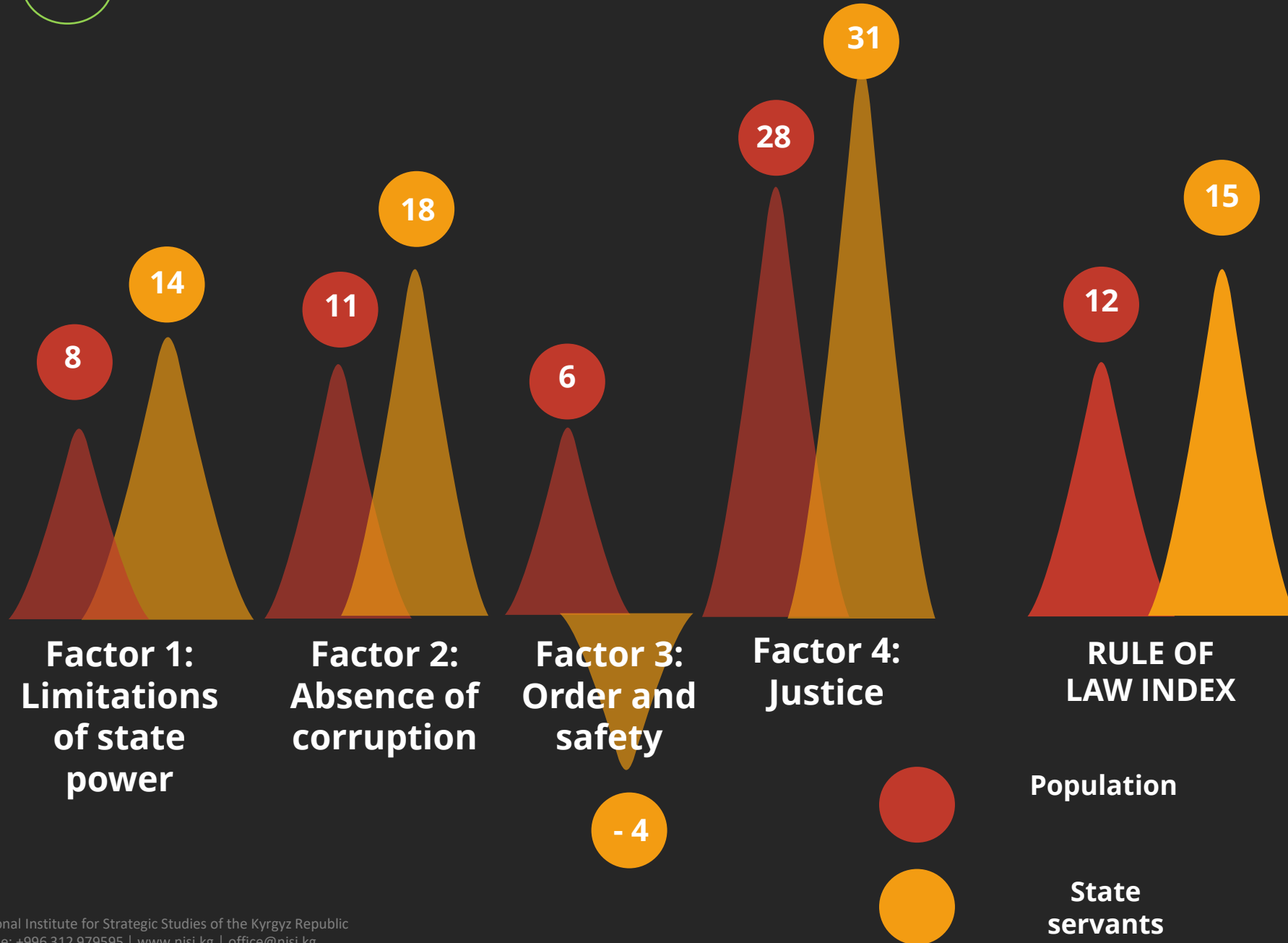

## VI RULE OF LAW INDEX

- *History:* The study was conducted on request from the Office of the President of the Kyrgyz Republic with the financial support of the UNDP office in Kyrgyzstan.
- *Results and consequences:* systematic, for deeper analysis and policy development, presentation for high-level officials

# RULE OF LAW INDEX 2016





- **GCI** and **RoL Index** are complementary to each other as first aims to measure the overall public sentiment in the country towards only executive bodies, while the latter measures the situation with the Rule of Law in a broader terms taking into account existing components/actors/conditions/and other factors of the Rule of Law;
- Both Indices are indicators of reforms implemented in the country for Kyrgyz Republic Government;
- There is a need for financial support to conduct **Rule of Law Index** on annual basis;
- Future plans: Changes in **GCI** methodology
  - BCI CCI** – Business and Consumer confidence indices as potential instruments for measuring corruption
  - City Development Index** – on public satisfaction with infrastructure, local government bodies, access to state services, etc.
