

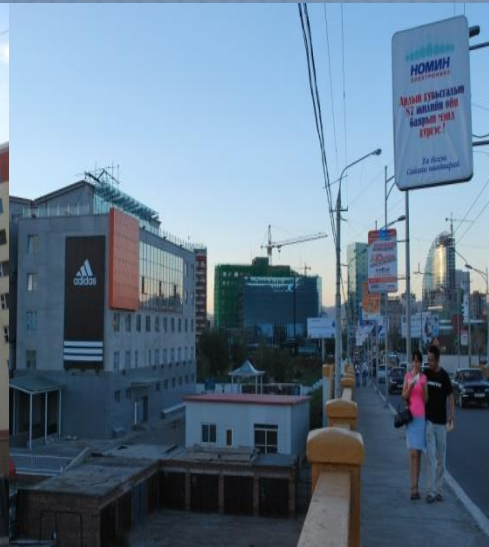

Groundwork of CNDS

- *Approved by Parliament Resolution No.12 in 2008*
 - *Government Decree No. 95, 2010*
 - *Prime Minister's Order No. 72, 2010*
 - *First long-term policy document with two basic stages:*
 - *2007-2015 years /Achieve MDGs and provide rapid economic development*
 - *2016-2021 years /Shift into knowledge based economy/*
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Content of the CNDS

- *6 High Priority Directions*
 - *124 Strategic Goals*
 - *523 Activities to be implemented*

Priorities of MDG-based CNDS of Mongolia

- *Achieve the MDGs and provide for all-round development of Mongolian people*
- *Develop export-oriented, private sector-led, high technology-driven manufacturing and services, ... deeper processing of agricultural products, and create a sustainable, knowledge-based economy*
- *Exploit mineral deposits of strategic importance, ensure intensive and high economic growth, ... and develop modern processing industry*
- *Develop regions, reduce urban-rural development disparities*
- *Create a sustainable environment for development by promoting capacities and means on adaptation to climate change, terminating imbalances in the country's ecosystems and protecting them*
- *Consolidate further political democracy, foster a transparent, accountable, just system free from corruption and red tape*

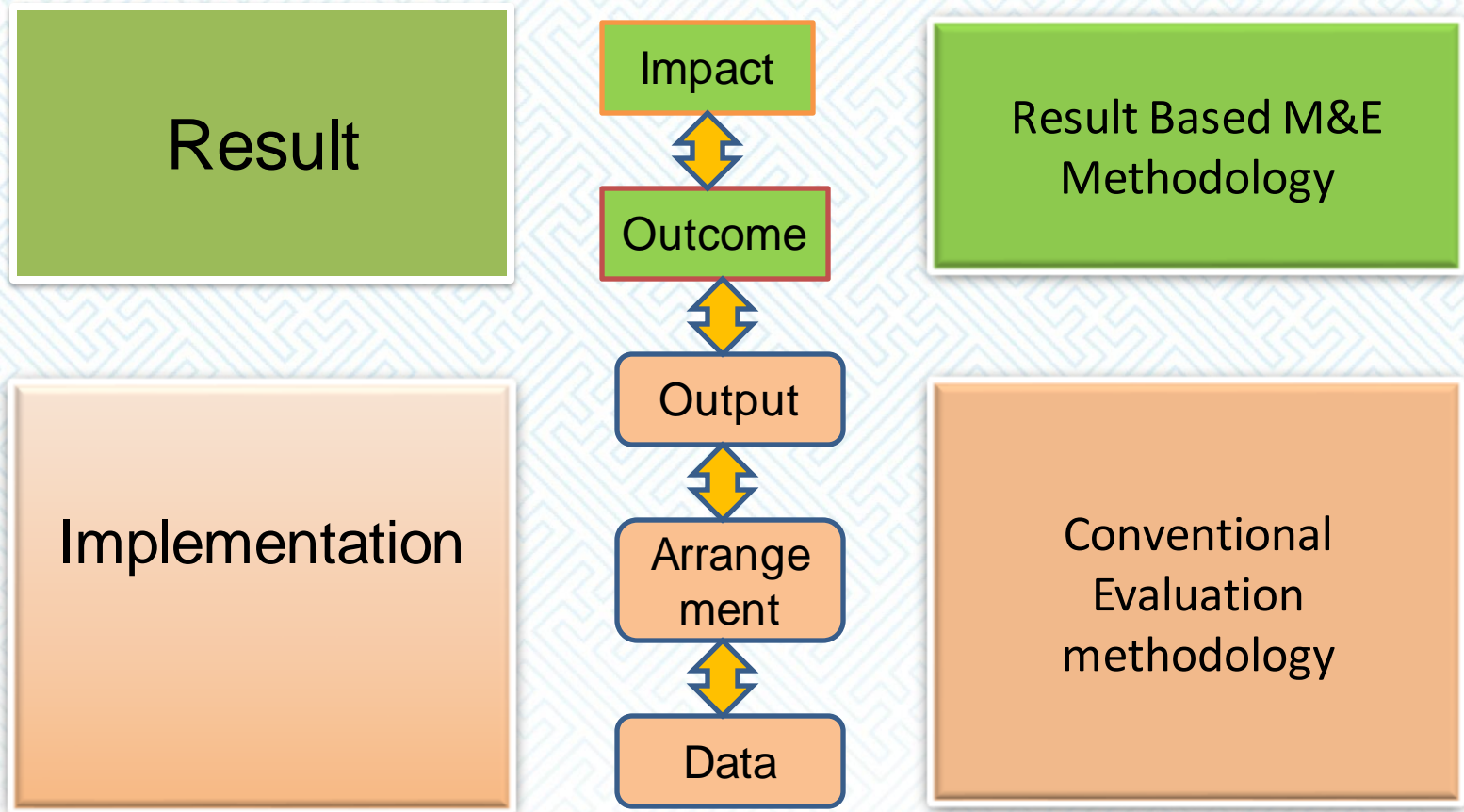


First evaluation of CNDS

- *Foreign and domestic teams worked together for six months*
- *Report of evaluation has been presented to the Cabinet for discussion and endorsed.*
- *The evaluation report is presented to the Parliament for autumn session discussion, 2011.*

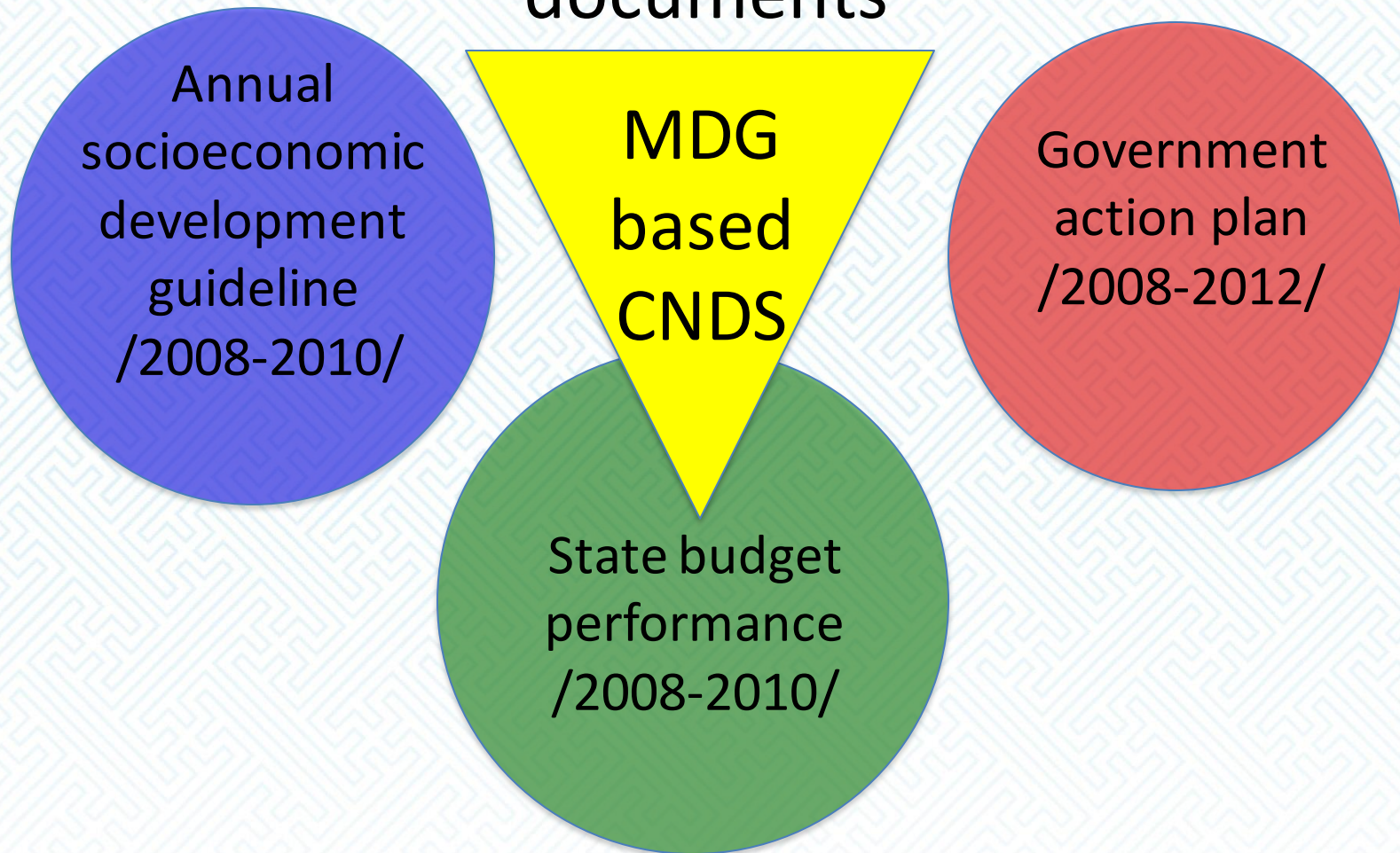


Evaluation methodology of the CNDS

Challenges

- *Use of result based M&E system needed more preparations.*
- *The interrelations between sectors has been weak.*
- *The indicators of some objectives and activities not clear enough.*

Some positive results

- *Process of transferring school system into 12 years is proceeding rapidly.*
- *Innovation issues, which are vital for development, are appreciated and preparation of legal environment for innovation is commenced.*
- *Resources for constituting fundamentals of the mining and processing industries and infrastructures are under the accumulation*
- *“Updated Civil Registration of Mongolia” is organized throughout the country and unified citizen database is being conducted rapidly.*
- *Approaches of world safety, recent concepts and definitions of safety are reflected in the Mongolian National Safety Concepts, and legal environment renewed as well.*



Some noticeable issues

- ▶ *Unemployment, and inequality among social groups are increasing.*
- ▶ *Implementation of policies for supporting families and family development is inefficient.*
- ▶ *Development policies and legal environment for providing gender equality concepts are incomplete.*
- ▶ *Science, technology development is stagnant.*
- ▶ *Weak correlation between activities involved in implementation of MDGs and financials.*



Conclusions

- *Insufficient understanding that MDGs-based CNDS is fundamental document for LT development*
- *MDGs aimed strategic goal, arrangement, achievement result's are seldom*
- *Overall Policy planning and reporting system is inadequate.*
- *Various goals and activities have more promissory base and political content, rather than tangible objectives.*
- *Policy implementations on poverty alleviation and unemployment; science, technology, natural environment, regions developments are slow.*



Issues to be considered

- *Improve structure of CNDS*
- *Clearly define criteria/indicators*
- *Provide better link between goals of CNDS and re-formulate the goals as result-based approaches*
- *Develop structure that can satisfy comprehensiveness of CNDS*
- *Constitute mid-term planning mechanism*
- *Along with formulation of top priority development directions of CNDS focus on financial and other resources*
- *Verify omitted goals and activities, then make necessary amendments in CNDS*
- *Provide vigorous consistency between strategic goals of CNDS and other policy documents*
